“Allergic contact dermatitis, or inflammation of the skin due to contact with some offending ingredient, prompts nearly six million doctor visits each year. The pathophysiology, clinical features, diagnosis, and treatment of allergic contact dermatitis are summarized in this lecture”.

15:00 “Novel autoimmune skin diseases of dogs and cats” by video wall prof Thierry Olivry

„In this lecture, I will present clinical, pathological, immunological and treatment information on the following recently characterized autoimmune skin diseases of dogs or cats: mucous membrane pemphigoid, epidermolysis bullosa acquisita, paraneoplastic pemphigus, vesicular cutaneous lupus erythematosus and exfoliative cutaneous lupus erythematosus”

Thierry Olivry, DrVet, PhD, DipACVD, DipECVD

After graduating from veterinary school in Toulouse (France) in 1984, Dr. Olivry joined a specialty practice in Paris where he received cases in internal medicine and dermatology. In 1991, he began a dermatology residency at the University of California at Davis. Following the residency, he obtained a PhD in comparative pathology at the same institution. He is board-certified by both European and American Colleges of Veterinary Dermatology. Dr. Olivry is presently Professor of Immunodermatology at the NC State University College of Veterinary Medicine in Raleigh, North Carolina. He holds also an appointment as Adjunct Research Associate Professor of Dermatology at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill School of Medicine. From 2001 to 2004, he was the Chair of the International Task Force on Canine Atopic Dermatitis. He was President of the European College of Veterinary Dermatology. In 2004, he received the ACVD Award for Excellence for Outstanding

Contributions to Science and Education, and in 2005 he was named Clinician of the Year at NCSU.

Dr. Olivry is the author or co-author of over 200 articles or book chapters published principally in the field of animal allergic and autoimmune skin diseases. His current areas of interest in research include canine atopic dermatitis, autoimmune blistering skin diseases and the relationship between skin structure and disease mechanisms.

Suzana Ljubojević, MD, MSc, PhD

Suzana Ljubojevic graduated from "Bishop Hartley High School", Columbus, Ohio, USA. School of medicine University Zagreb graduated in 1996. In 1998 Dr Ljubojevic started specialization in the field of dermatology and venerology in the Department of Dermatology and Venerology, University Hospital Centre and School of medicine, Zagreb, Croatia. Dr Ljubojevic passed dermatology Board exam in April 2002 and become specialist for dermatology and venerology with special interest in allergology, clinical immunology, contact dermatitis and sexual transmitted diseases. In 2002, Dr Ljubojevic finished postgraduate studies, and become master of science in 2003. The master thesis was "Contact sensibility in seborrheic dermatitis patients". In 2005 Dr Ljubojevic got PhD degree. The title of PhD thesis was "The significance of asymptomatic male partner in women with cervical intraepithelial neoplasia". In 2008 Dr Ljubojevic become assistant professor at the University of Zagreb in the field of basic medical science, clinical medical science, public health and medical prevention, dentistry and pharmacy, branch dermatology.

Dr Ljubojevic visited different institutions for scientific improvement: 1) Klinik für Dermatologie und Allergologie, Technische Universität, Munich, Germany; 2) Abteilung für Immunodermatologie und Infektiöse Hautkrankheiten Allgemeines Krankenhaus für Dermatologie Vienna, Austria; 3) University of Southern California, and different outpatients (Dr Gail Drayton, Dr Rhichard Strick, Dr Victor Newcomer i Dr Sheldon Spector); LA, California, SAD; 4) Royal Adeleide Hospital, Adeleide, Australia.

Dr Ljubojevic have published many articles: 9 current contents and 38 articles which are published in index medicus journal. Dr Ljubojevic actively participated (oral or poster presentation) on 15 international and 33 domestic congresses and she is author or coauthor of 117 congress summaries and 28 book chapters.
